WHEREAS, has is presently preparing to initiate plans for a Conway Bypass; and


WHEREAS, in an effort to comply with all State and Federal Regulations, the City commits to follow certain provision.

Re: NEPA Resolution for the Conway Bypass

Dear Mayor Kinley,

The best way to handle the National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA) Resolution for the Conway Bypass appears to be straight forward and to the point:

Be it resolved by the City of Conway that the provisions of the National Environmental Protection Act shall be followed in all phases of the development of the Conway Bypass.

The purpose of the resolution is to assure that all actions on the part of the City are part of the environmental record and thus do not have to be "re-done" to comply with NEPA requirements. It appears that the worst the City may be doing is committing to bend over backwards to assure that all environmental policies are considered. More paper work in the form of studies may be needed. These would probably be performed anyway as part of the Corridor Study and Environmental Impact Statement. The resolution also assures that all public hearings will be part of the environmental record. It is important to note that "environment" includes other concerns important to the citizens of Conway such as: sound pollution, visual impact, air pollution, socio-economic affects, and historical and archaeological sites as well.
